**Camp Shakespeare**     *Rising 7th-12th grade*  
**June 4-14**     **Monday-Thursday**     **9:00-1:00**  
**\$350**     **.50 English Honors Credit**     **Instructor: Chrissy Monaco**

A Midsummer Night's Dream has enchanted audiences for more than 400 years with its celebration of magic, dreams, and love... a perfect way to spend your summer in the company of our greatest playwright! In this two-week course, students will rehearse and perform a shortened production of one of Shakespeare's greatest comedies. Camp Shakespeare offers a performance opportunity as well as a close reading of a canonized text to 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students. Scripts, costumes, show t-shirts, and daily lunches are all included in the price.

**Reading and Writing Poetry**     *Rising 9th-12th grade*  
**Tuesdays from June 5-July 10**     **10:00-12:00**  
**\$350**     **.50 English Honors credit**     **Instructor: Kate Currie**

Reading and Writing Poetry will focus on the study of contemporary poets. The class will split the focus between reading poetry critically and writing original poetry with the goal of publication and performance. This class will have short critical essays, but will mainly focus on writing poetry rather than essays. We will write several different styles of poetry helping aspiring poets discover and hone their voice. This course will satisfy half an English honors credit and will meet once weekly and take place largely online.

**Terror and Terrorism**     *Rising 9th-12th grade*  
**Thursdays from June 7-August 2**     **10:00-12:00**  
**\$350**     **.50 Social Studies Honors credit**     **Instructor: Weston Nunn**

Students will investigate the origins, motivations, and actions of state and non-state terror organizations. They will gain an appreciation for the importance of how beautiful ideas can motivate people to commit inhuman acts of cruelty. Students will improve their abilities at synthesizing information from diverse primary and secondary materials, hone analytical writing skills, and gain experience with college-style seminar discussions.

**College Writing Workshop**     *Rising 12th grade*  
**Mondays on July 9, 16, 23**     **9:00-12:00**  
**\$50 / session or \$125 for all 3**     **Instructor: Weston Nunn**

Rising seniors will focus on writing as it pertains to college applications in this three week hands-on workshop. Students will develop their personal statements, prepare college essays, and perfect their high school résumé. Students will have a break during the three hour workshop.

**Foreign Film and the Modern World**     *Rising 9th-12th grade*  
**Wednesdays June 6-July 11**     **10:00-12:00**  
**\$350**     **.50 Social Studies Honors or English Honors credit**  
**Instructor: Tim Streit**

This course examines both the cinema culture of various countries around the world and an overview of late 20th century/early 21st century history through film. We will examine how the norms and cultural trends of these nations influence the films they produce, while also analyzing how global events have shaped the messages of those works.

No background in film studies is required for this course. You will, however, be asked to look at and think about films in a more reflective manner than some of you have in the past. We will read about and view the films from a variety of perspectives; we will treat the films as texts. Your responses to these texts and close viewing and reading of the texts will be important components of this class.

**Graphic Novels as Literature**     *Rising 9th-12th grade*  
**Predominantly online**     **June 4-August 2**  
**\$350**     **.50 English Honors credit**     **Instructor: Sam Wilson**

This course will focus on the critical reading of graphic novels, examining them in the same ways we analyze classic literature. Students will be exposed to graphic novels from multiple genres, analyze character and plot development, create an original character and plot line, and analyze a self-selected graphic novel in a major essay. The course will take place predominantly online, with few scheduled meetings; essays will be an integral part of the student's grade, as well as an online discussion forum and participation in seminar style discussions during face-to-face classes. Students will learn to read everything, not only the classic works assigned in school, as literature, and decide whether or not the selected material belongs in the literary canon.

**Introduction to Organic Chemistry**  
**Exclusively online**     **June 4-August 2**  
**\$350**     **.50 Science Honors credit**     **Instructor: Jessica Iseman**

**Pre-requisite: Chemistry.** The course will focus on basic organic chemistry including naming of carbon containing compounds also known as organic molecules (nomenclature), functional groups, basic organic reactions, basic stereochemistry, and basic reaction mechanisms. The objective of this course is to prepare students with a base level knowledge of what would be covered at the beginning of a college-level first semester course in Organic Chemistry. All lectures and assignments will be given online. No in-person meeting times will be required.
