Founded in 1995 as Trinity Collegiate School, now known as Trinity-Byrnes Collegiate School, TBCS enrolls approximately 254 college bound students in grades 7-12. TBCS is a coeducational, non-discriminatory, college-preparatory day school located on a rural 100-acre campus southwest of Darlington and serves the seven-county Pee Dee region of South Carolina. The school fosters development of every student's intellect and character through strong academics, a wide range of athletics, and extracurricular activities.

Faculty: Trinity-Byrnes Collegiate School has 31 faculty members, of whom 45% hold advanced degrees. The student teacher ratio is 8:1.

Technology and Facilities: All classrooms are equipped with large flat screen digital televisions, AppleTV, and/or digital projectors/screens. All students and teachers use iPads or other tablet devices with supplementary text books if needed. The 5 main buildings include 27 total classrooms/learning spaces which include a performing arts stage, dance studio, music room, 2 art studios, 2 science labs, 1 digital media center, and a fitness room.

Class Schedule: Students have 8 class options per semester on a rotating schedule. Six meet each day, with 1 class dropping in the morning and afternoon. On a 4-day rotation each class meets for 60 minutes 3 days out of 4. This schedule is designed for students to have ample opportunity to include a variety of elective courses outside of the core curriculum.

Class of 2017: The 45 members of the Class of 2017 were accepted to four year colleges in 18 different states; 86% were offered academic or athletic scholarships in addition to the SC tuition lottery scholarships.

Advanced Placement Recognition: In 2016 the College Board recognized 9 AP Scholars at TBCS: 4 AP Scholars, 3 with Honor, 2 with Distinction, and 1 National AP Scholar.

Class Rank: Trinity-Byrnes Collegiate School utilizes the South Carolina Uniform Grading policy which determines class rank. While Trinity-Byrnes Collegiate School has a policy on the academic ranking of students, rank is not used for the purpose of college admissions. Questions concerning the South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy ranking should be directed to the College Counseling Office.

GPA: The SC Uniform Grading Scale assigns quality points per numeric average and gives weighted credit for Honors and AP level work. Honors courses are weighted an additional .5 point and AP courses are weighted an additional 1 point.

Honors and AP: Enrollment in Honors and Advanced Placement coursework requires faculty endorsement. Enrollment in AP coursework is an honor typically reserved for juniors and seniors. Honors courses are designated on transcripts by use of H. Advanced Placement courses are designated AP. Students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam.

Financial Aid: Based on need and is determined by the School Scholarship Services of Princeton, NJ.

Standard level courses (CP), as well as those designated Honors or AP, are demanding in quality, content, and design. Enrollment in standard level coursework does not signal a lack of academic rigor or challenge.
